- There is a **Quiet Room** available in the back of the church across from the Nursery for families with infants and small children if needed.
- **Nursery Care** is available for infants through 3 years old in the Nursery located in the east hallway of the church.

Sunday School Classes for Children & Youth

- ◆ Families start worship together in our Sanctuary. During the service the children are invited up to the front steps for the Children's Message.
- ◆ After the Children's Message, all Pre-school through 5th grade students are escorted to their respective classrooms (listed below in bold) by their Sunday School teachers. Parents are welcome to join their children.
- ◆ After the service parents can pick up their children from their classrooms in the McCullen Center building next to the church.
- **Pre-school and Kindergarten children – Sunshine Room** located down the sidewalk to the left as you exit church.
- **1st and 2nd Grade students – Room 204** located on the second floor of the McCullen Center Building (the building next to the church).
- **3rd – 5th grade students – Room 202** located on the second floor of the McCullen Center Building (the building next to the church).
- **Youth (6th – 12th grade) - Garage (Youth Room)** located on the 2nd floor of the McCullen Center Building. Youth gathers at 10:40 am.

"A Certain Path – Our Journey Together" (Part 1)

Read Psalm 95:6-11

Among the most amazing feats in history, none rival the Exodus. The odds stacked against the Jews escaping Egypt were astronomical. Yet God used this journey to grow people of faith.

- What happened at Meribah and Massah (v. 8; see Ex. 17:1-7)? How was God on trial?

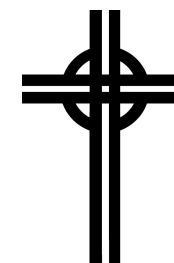
