- There is a **Quiet Room** available in the back of the church across from the Nursery for families with infants and small children if needed.

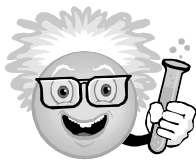

For Further Reflection on Sunday's Sermon . . .

“Walking in the Light: Speech, Temper, Work, Relating”

Read Ephesians 4:25-32

We need to listen and hear, to sense and understand, especially in the place where we are best known and our lives are most intricately intertwined.

- According to Paul, what specific behaviors distinguish the Christian lifestyle from the non-Christian lifestyle?
- Is it possible to change conduct without a transformation of the heart (v. 18)? Likewise, can the heart be changed without a resulting change of conduct? Why?
- What is one way you have seen the contrast of the “old” and the “new” in your life since your commitment to Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord?
- Compare Paul's view of a Spirit-filled life with your own life. In comparison, how full have you been with the Spirit this week? What do you want to work on, so that the Spirit may fill you more?
