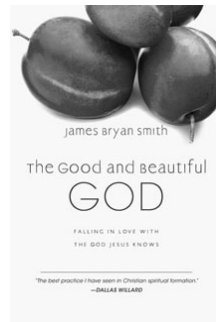
YOUNG ADULT (18-26 years) meets 1st and 3rd Thursdays from 9 – 11 pm.

Drop-In Bible Study – 8:45 am Sundays, taught by Ron Reynolds. "**God of the Bible vs. God of Philosophy**" Apologetics is often downplayed or downright ridiculed as arguing for a sub-Christian God. It must be admitted that general revelation can tell us much less about God than the Bible, but if it tells us truth, then we should press it upon men and women as a partial, but accurate, picture of the God they should worship. Dr. Sproul explains in this lecture how partial knowledge of God is not necessarily untrue. DVD with Dr. Sproul.
